







Definition - all the inhabitants of a particular place.

- The current population of Europe is 747,879,218 as of Tuesday,
 January 12, 2021, based on the latest United Nations estimates.
- Europe's population is equivalent to 9.78% of the total world population.
- Europe ranks number 3 among populated regions of the world.

Languages spoken in Europe and European countries.

There are 24 official languages in Europe... but there are actually more than 200 languages spoken on the continent.

English is still the most spoken language in the EU by far, with German now spoken by 36% of citizens and French spoken by 29% of the EU's new smaller population of 446 million people. Italian comes fourth at 18%, followed by 17% for Spanish.
