
Let's remind ourselves of the story of Mary Anning's life:



Your writing must have:

- a beginning this is where you write about where and when Mary was born;
- a middle this is where most of the things we know about Mary's life happened. For
 example, how and why did Mary become interested in fossil hunting; who helped Mary to
 understand about fossils and fossil hunting; what happened when Mary found the sea
 monster; what happened to the new creatures that Mary found;
- an ending this is where we can write a few sentences about where and when Mary died.
 You could also include a sentence about the importance of the work Mary did to our understanding of the prehistoric world.


















If you have written your Mary Anning story in a little book, you can decorate the front cover and write your name on the front of the book as the author of a story about the life of Mary Anning.
