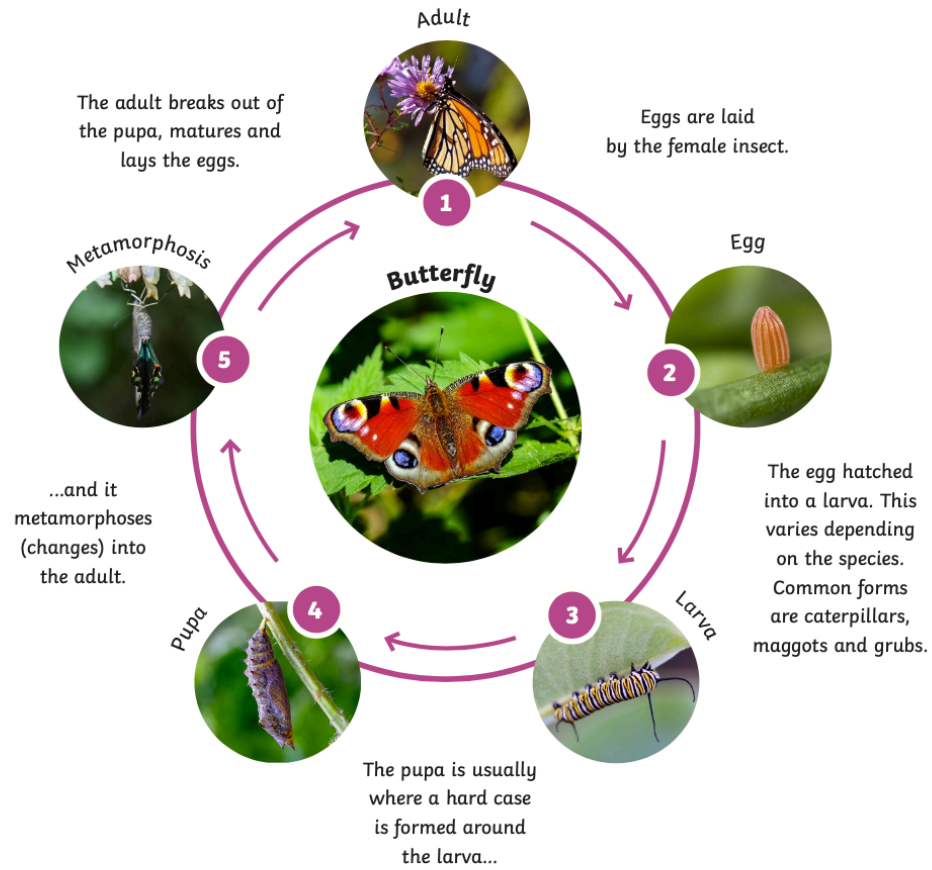

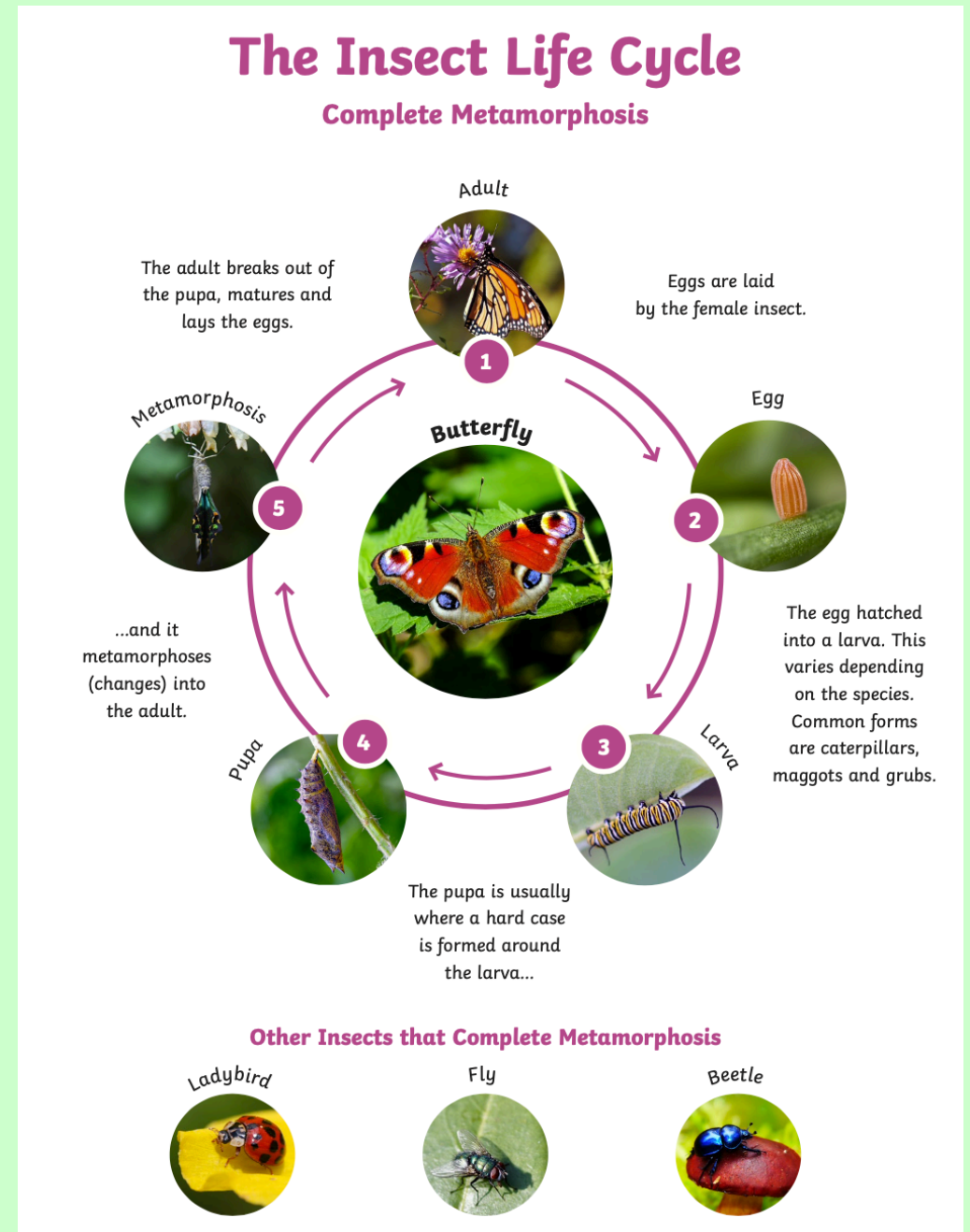

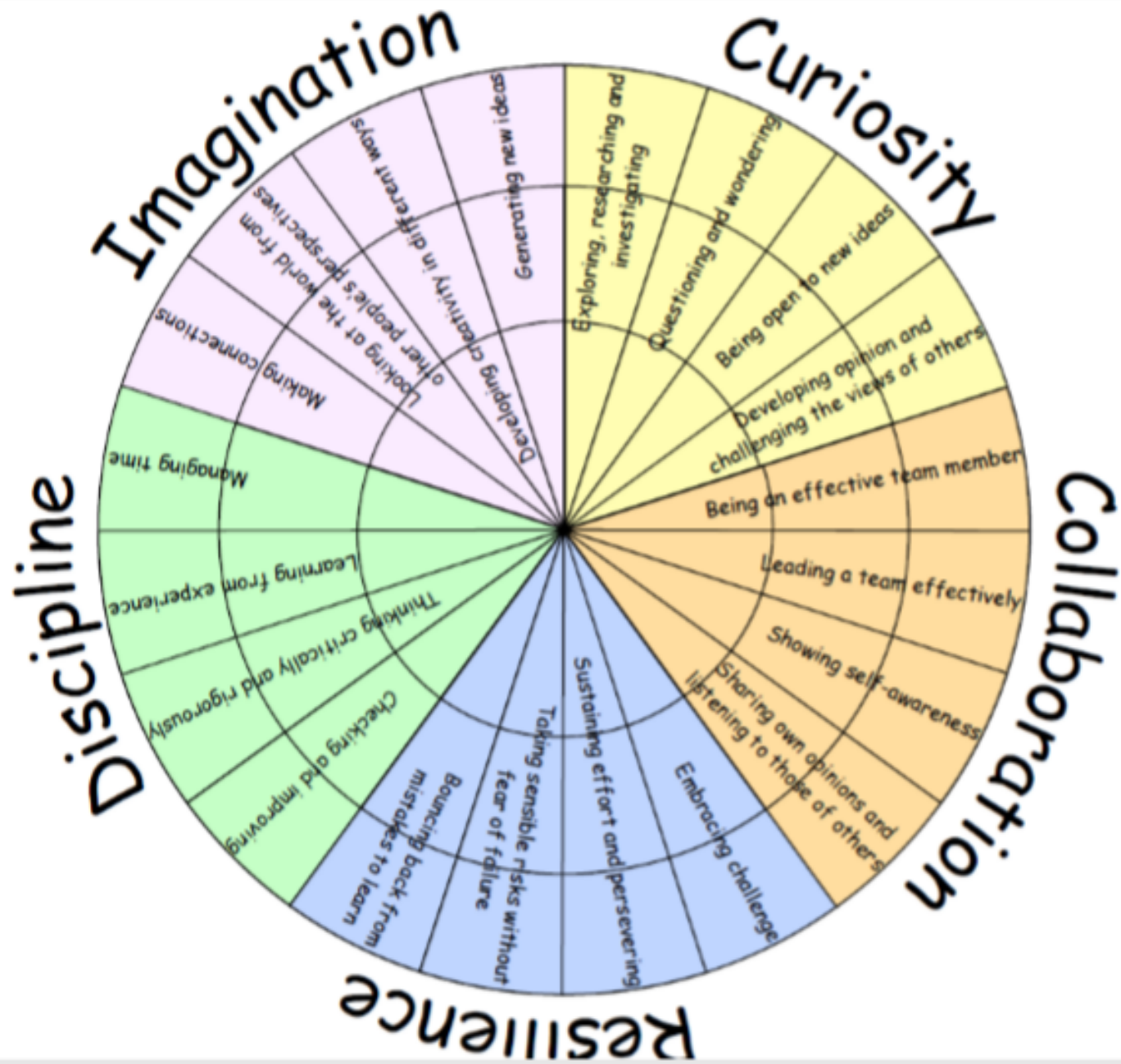

## Vocabulary of a Butterfly Life Cycle

**Caterpillar** - the larvae stage of a butterfly.

**Chrysalis** - same as pupa, the third stage of butterfly life cycle.

**Emerge** - to come out of something.

**Instar** - another term for molting, shedding of skin.

**Larvae** - the second stage of metamorphosis, during which a caterpillar has new wings.

**Life cycle** - a series of stages through which an organism passes between recurrences of a primary stage.

**Metamorphosis** - a series of developmental stages often marked by body changes.

**Molting** - shedding of the skin, so that larvae can grow.

**Pudding** - when butterflies crawl all over the ground near shallow water.

**Pupa** - third stage of a butterfly life cycle, when larvae changes into adult. Also called Chrysalis.
