Why is it important for the area? What areas are man made?
















Day 2: Nottingham Maps Task 1:

What would you find there?




Day 2: Nottingham Maps

You might want to use Google Maps or Google Earth for this.




Day 3: Nottingham Maps



- 2. Go 3 squares to the EAST. Where are you now?
- 3. Go 3 squares to the SOUTH. Where are you now?
- 4. Go 4 squares to the WEST. Where are you now?
- 5. Go 5 squares NORTH. Where are you now.
- 6. Go 3 squares SOUTH and then 2 squares WEST. Where are you?
- 7. Go 3 squares SOUTH. Where are you?
- 8. Go 4 squares EAST, 2 squares NORTH then 3 squares WEST. Where are you?
