INTELLIGENT PRACTICE



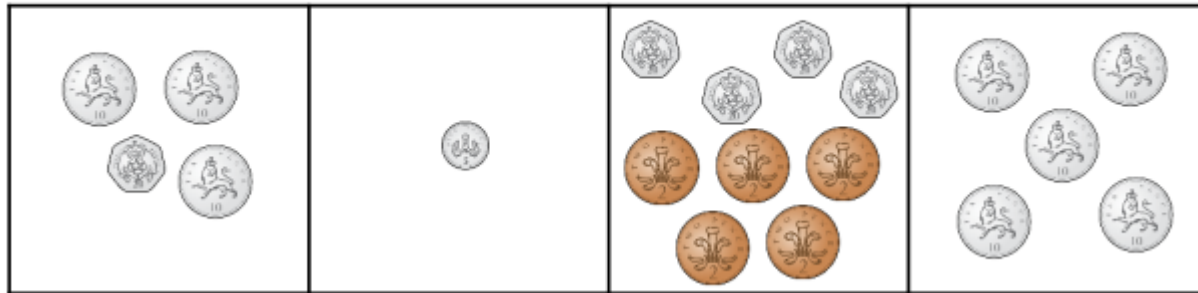
How can you make 26p? Use the coins from the box and draw them in your book.
