


Nim's Island

If you have completed all the English lessons this week, you should now have a draft version of your story extract when you put them all together.

Look again at your blueprint and the slides from earlier in the week to remind yourself of the features you've practised.

Check that your writing makes sense when you put it all together.

If you notice any bits that don't make sense or could be improved, do that first.

 Your task today is to write your final version of your story extract. This should be your absolute best work, with perfect spelling and punctuation. It should be set out like the original. It should take you 30 to 40 minutes.
