
#### RECALL:

3: The Vikings raided the monastery at Lindisfarne.


4: The Vikings returned to Scandinavia with the treasure they had stolen.




5: Reasons why the raid was successful for the Vikings.

## P3 - the Vikings raided the monastery

• Start with a statement: tell the reader that the Vikings attacked the monastery. Include a fronted adverbial to explain when.





Have a go at writing a draft of paragraph 3.

# P4 - the Viking returned to Scandinavia with the treasure they had stolen

Again, we'll start with a statement, then add more sentences to give more detail. Again, we'll use a fronted adverbial to make it clear when it happened.

Have a go at writing a draft of your fourth paragraph.

Once they had taken all the riches they could find, the Viking attackers returned to their longships to begin the long journey back to Scandinavia. They were keen to celebrate the success of their raid and they wanted to share the knowledge of the new land they had found.
