


Viking Invasion

Today we are going to doing our final checks and improvements, this time looking at vocabulary.

Please start by reading through all your writing again. Are there any words or phrases that you've repeated several times?



Have a look at this example. Can you see which words and phrases are repeated?

Look at all this repetition!

The first time that each of these words or phrases appears is fine, but after that it might be better to use alternative words or phrases.

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There's no need to repeat this. We can just get rid of it.

We can use a shorter version of the phrase here. Our reader will know what we mean.

There's no need for this fronted adverbial.

We could find another word to replace 'Vikings'. The reader will understand who we're talking about.

We don't need to keep telling the reader where the Vikings found.

The fearless Vikings set off in their longships across the North Sea, not knowing what they would find. The first place the explorers came to was the Island of Lindisfarne, off the northeast coast of England. There, the Norse adventurers found a monastery, which they decided to attack.

Compare this version. There is less writing, but also less repetition.

How to remove repetition

1: Can you just get rid of the repeated bit? Will the writing still make sense without it?

2: You could try replacing nouns with pronouns. The Vikings - they Monks - they Lindisfarne - it Monastery - it

3: Use alternative words. There is a list on the next page.

Check your spellings

- If there are any you're not sure of, try using Google's builtin dictionary. Just type 'dictionary' into Google.
- If you have Siri / Cortana / Google assistant / Alexa or similar, you can ask it how to spell a word!
- Key spellings: Vikings Lindisfarne -ed suffix
