#### When we're back in school next week...

we're going to start making booklets about the geography we've been studying.

This lesson is to remind you of all that learning and to help you start planning how you will present your booklet.

You should fill in the planning sheet as you go through these pages.

We started with a philosophical question: how is the world connected? This could be the title of your booklet, or you could choose a slightly different title. Have a think then fill in the first section of your planning sheet.

#### Front cover

You will need a design for the front of your booklet that gives the reader an idea of the information they will find inside.

#### Contents page

What headings will you give each section?

You could use **statements** as your headings

Eg: How the world is connected by trade

Or you could use questions

Eg: How is the world connected by trade?

Decide how you will write your headings and fill in this part of the sheet.

### Layers of the Earth

Each of your pages will start with an introductory statement. For example:

The planet Earth is made of layers that are connected.

Use this section of the planning sheet to practise an introduction statement. Next, write what facts you are going to include next to each of the words in the table. How will you illustrate this part of your booklet?

#### Trade

Again, start with an introduction statement.

Another way that the world is connected is...

Next, think about how you will explain what each type of trade is and how you can include maps, diagrams or illustrations to illustrate the information.

Write down any technical words you will use in the *glossary* section of the table.

Continue to fill in the table in the same way for the 'transport' and 'technology' sections.

You might need to look back through your geography work from before half term to remind yourself of what you have learned.

When you get to the 'beliefs / ideas' section, pick one of the ideas from that lesson. Write down some key facts about it. You might need to do some more independent research on the internet for this section.

you should have a good idea of what will be in your booklet, and we should be able to get started next week.
