International food trade

What does
international
trade mean?

International trade is the exchange of goods or services between countries.

What reasons can you think of for why the trading of **food** between countries is important?

Reasons:

1. **Not all countries have suitable conditions for growing food** and so they trade with other countries. For example, the United Arab Emirates is mostly desert and so it needs to import lots of food from other countries.
2. **Different climates (a country's typical weather, temperature and rainfall) allow different foods to be grown.** For example, Columbia has a good climate for growing coffee beans and the United Kingdom does not.
3. **Countries can earn money by exporting foods to other countries.** The worlds biggest food exporter is the United States of America.

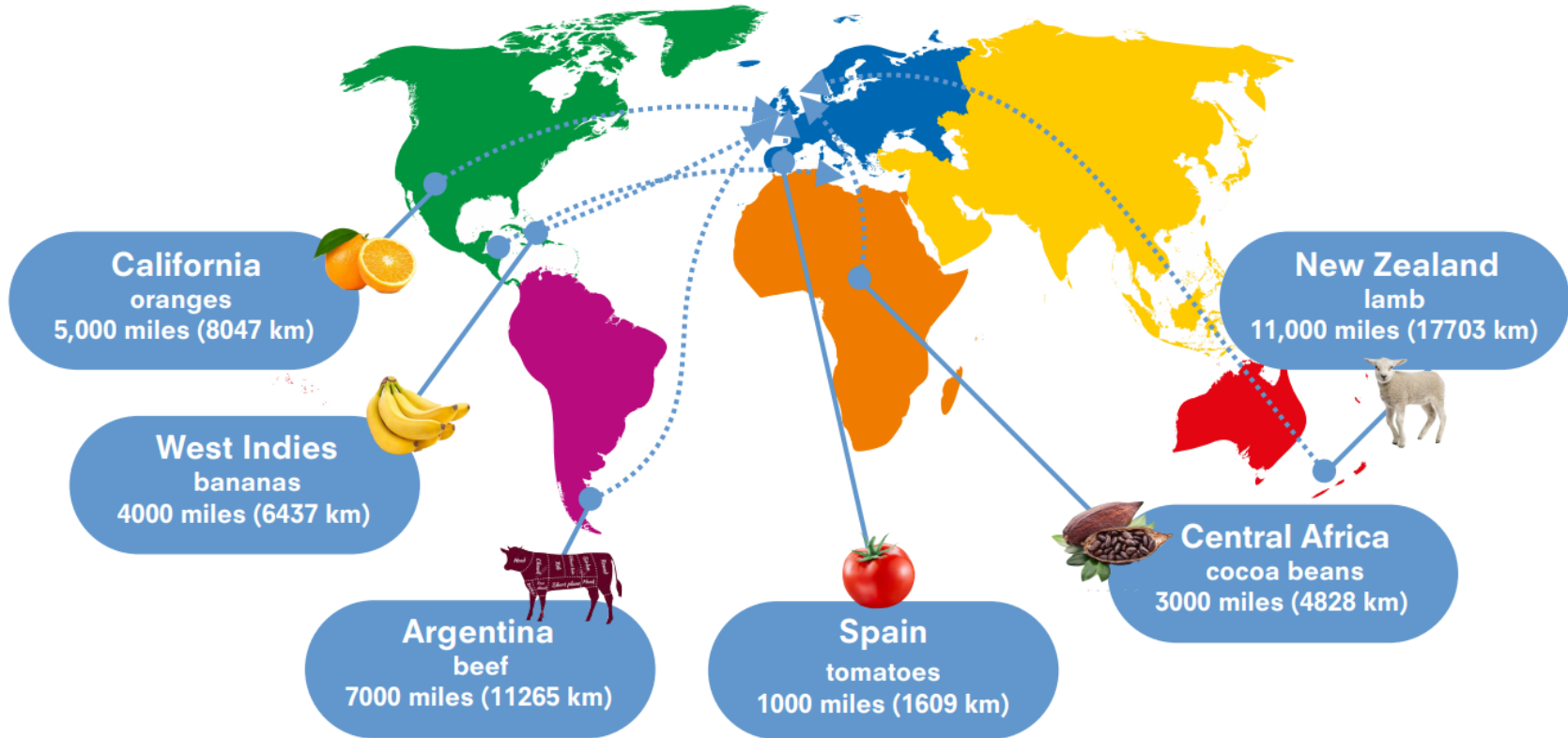
What do you think is the most traded food and the most traded drink?

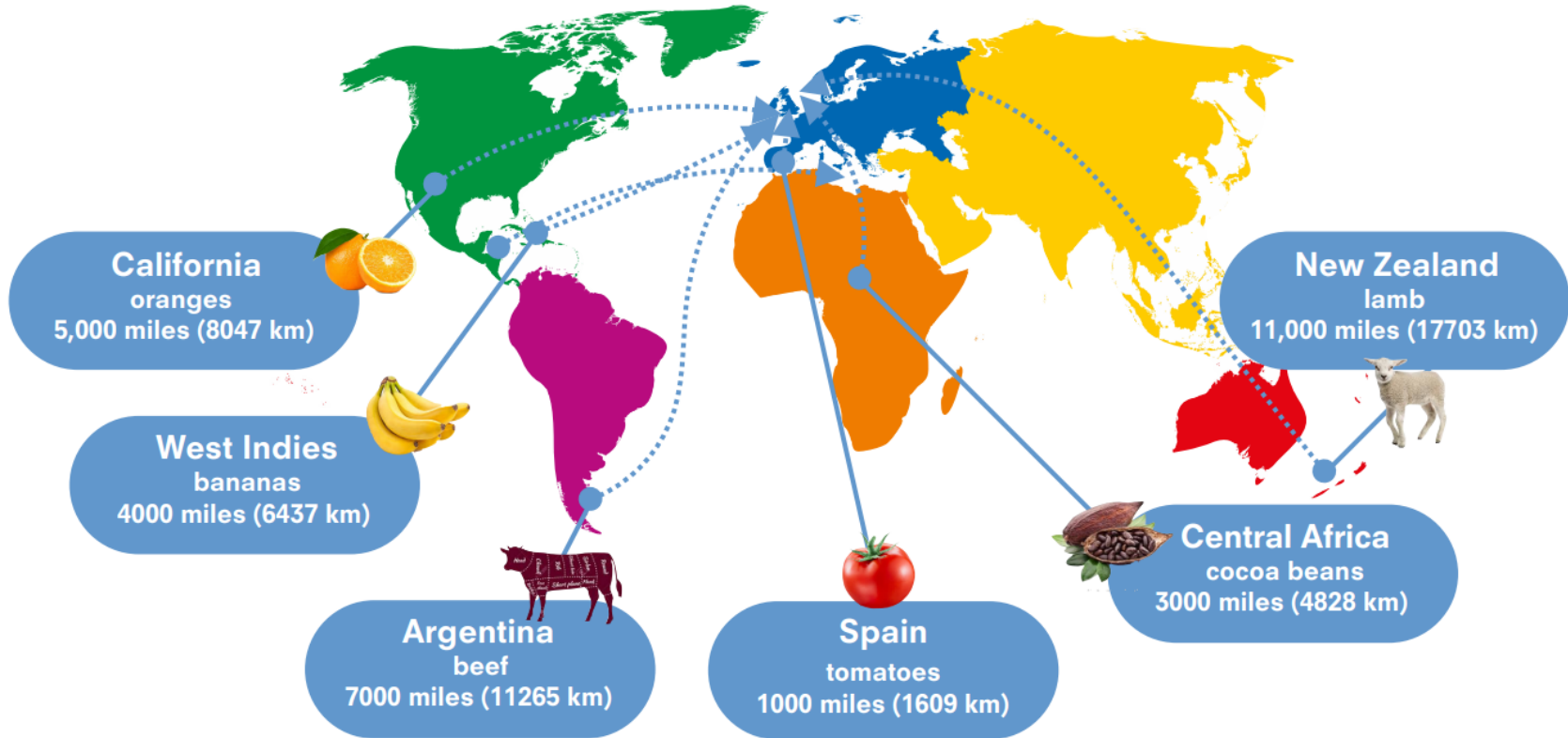
Food Miles = The distance a food has been transported to reach a chosen country.

Food Miles = The distance a food has been transported to reach a chosen country.

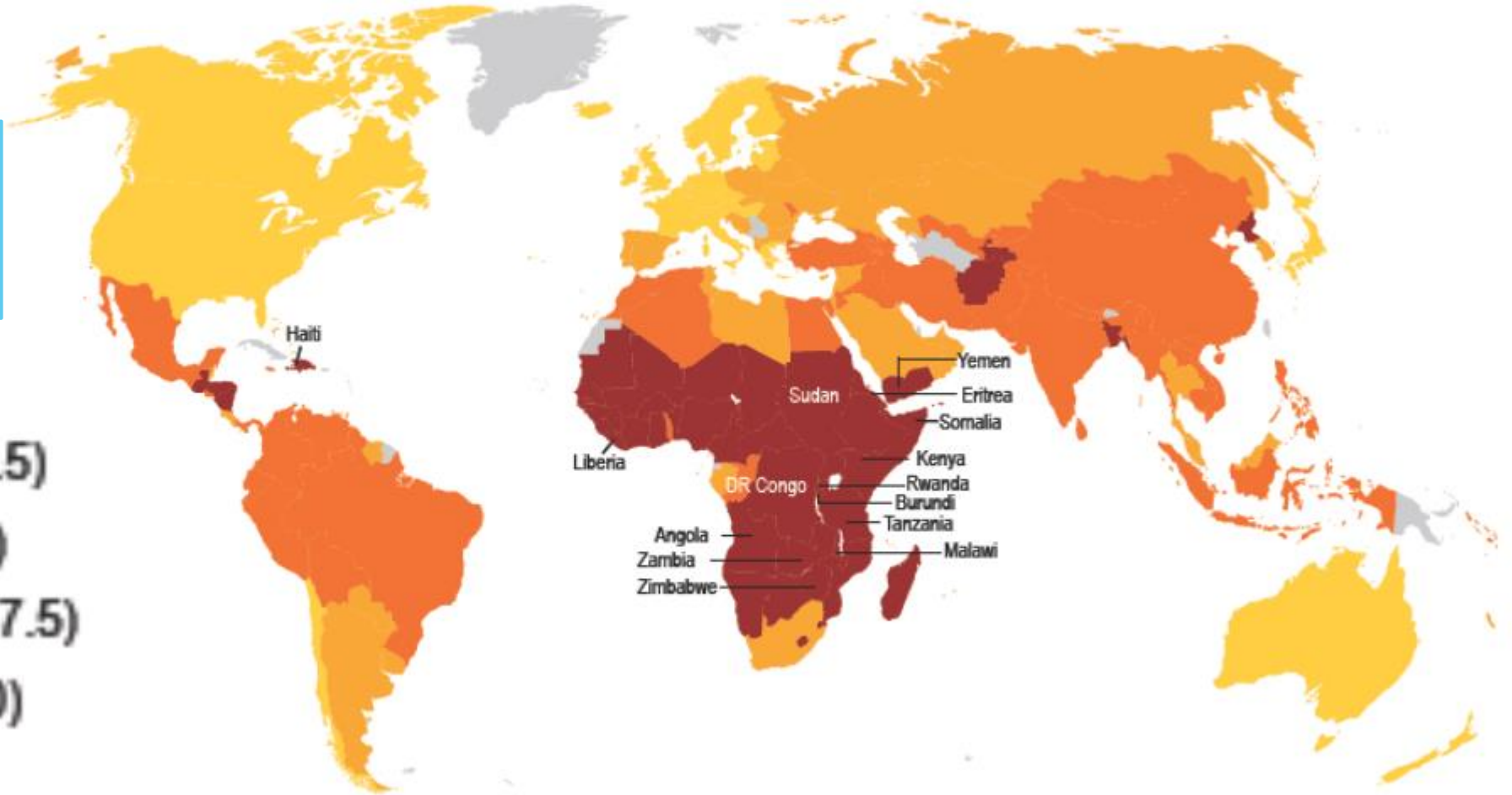
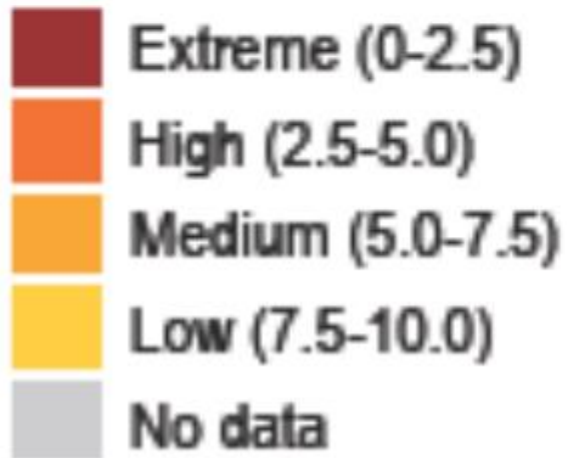


What is the total food miles for these combinations? As an extra challenge can you calculate them in km too? (Kilometres)

- 1) Bananas + Tomatoes + Oranges = **10,000 miles or 16,093 km**
- 2) Beef + Lamb + Cocoa Beans = **21,000 miles or 33,796 km**

Food security = A country's ability to grow and obtain enough food for its population (all of the people that live there).

Extreme = high risk of not having enough food.

Possible answers:

Lot's of land that is unsuitable to grow crops and a climate that is very dry so they can't grow food or look after large herds of animals.

This means the country would be reliant on other countries to provide it with food and this costs a lot of money.
