This is intended to reduce the number of vehicles on the road and lower congestion and pollution.

Whilst congestion charges do reduce the number of cars on the road, some people can't afford to pay the charges. This makes it unfair as only some people have the privilege of using their vehicles.

Using public transport and bicycles would reduce the number of cars on the road. This would reduce congestion and pollution in cities. However, bus routes don't always go where people need to be and may not arrive when people need them to arrive. Bicycles are intended to share the roads with other vehicles and this can make it a dangerous way to travel.
