Here are some words that rhyme with three: tree, bee, be, free, key, flea, knee, pea, plea, sea, tea...

This is the second line for the first verse in our poem:

Past an old acacia tree.

This is my second line:

Past the icebergs in the sea.

Did you notice I changed an old acacia tree to the icebergs in the sea?

These are the last two lines of the third verse:

So Tumpe counted three.

This is my version:

So Tugba counted three.

Did you notice I changed the name to Tugba?
